

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

The format of the paper:

- Maximum length: **8 pages**, including all tables, graphs, and references; the papers that do not comply with the criterion may be rejected by reviewers
- Format: **A4** (210 x 297 mm)
- Margins: **2.54 cm** on all 4 sides, justified on both sides
- Spacing: single
- Font: **Times New Roman**
- Font size: **12**
- **No** numeration is required
- The numbers and titles of pictures should be positioned **below** the pictures; the numbers and titles of tables should be positioned **above** the tables; both pictures and tables should be inserted after they are mentioned in the text (for example, Picture 1, Table 2) If the pictures and tables are taken from another source, the original source must be stated in brackets, for example: (Bartoluci, 2003, 71).
- Language: **Serbian – Latin, English**

The style and organization of the text:

Scientific papers usually follow the **(A)IMRAD** format: **A**bstract, **I**ntroduction, **M**ethods, **R**esults, **A**nd **D**iscussion.

Beside these elements, articles should also contain Conclusion and Literature.

The format of the paper:

We recommend the following format:

TITLE – CENTERED

Name(s) of the author(s) (maximum three authors per paper) ¹

The institution where the author works – city, state

Abstract: 150 to 200 words (If the paper is in Serbian, the abstract and keywords should be sent in English, as well)

Keywords: 3 to 5 words

Quoting references in the text

After quoting (always between quotation marks), or using another author's fundamental idea, the author's last name, publication date and page should be stated, for example (Bartoluci, 2003, 71). If a work by more than three authors is quoted, only the first author's last name is to be stated along with the abbreviation **et al.** (if the paper is in English), or **i sar.** (if the paper is in Serbian).

Reference list

A reference list is provided at the end of the paper and should contain only the sources the author refers to in the text. The sources are quoted in line with the APA referencing model (www.apastyle.org).

The reference list should be composed in alphabetical order using the last name of the first author and complete info. The titles of books and journals should be in *italics*. It is not necessary to put the titles of papers from journals and books into italics.

Compose a reference list using the example provided below by adapting it to your paper:

Books

Author, A. (publication date). *The Title of the Book*. The place of publication: The Publisher.

Author, A., Author, B. & Author, C. (publication date). *The Title of the Book*. The place of publication: The Publisher.

Chapters or papers from books

Author(s) of the chapter. (publication date). The Title of the Chapter. Ed.: A. Last Name (Ed.), *The Title of the Book* (pages from-to). The place of publication: The Publisher.

Papers from Conference Proceedings

Author(s). (publication date). The Title of the Paper. Ed.: *Conference Name*. The place of publication: Publisher, pages from-to.

Papers from journals

Author, A. (publication date). The Title of the Paper. *Journal Name*. Volume (issue no.), pages.

Author, A., Author, B. & Author, C. (publication date). The Title of the Paper. *Journal Name*. Volume (issue no.), pages.

Sources from the Internet

Author. *Title*. URL (Page access date)
